Dear Ms. Brennan:

I am writing on behalf of the residents of the Village of Martin's Additions (zip code 20815). We are one of the many incorporated municipalities in the Chevy Chase area of Maryland, located not far from the Washington, DC northwest boundary line.

I wanted to make you aware of the unacceptable service from the U.S. Postal Service and to solicit your help in ensuring that it is ameliorated immediately. Our mail service has been erratic, to say the least, these past three months. Sometimes the mail arrives in the morning; sometimes it arrives at 9 or 10 at night; and sometimes it doesn't arrive *at all*. For example, I did not get any delivery at my house this past Thursday (October 8, 2015) at 3500 Bradley Lane.

Last week, a resident came to our monthly Council meeting to ask for help as her mail carrier just kind of shrugged it off when she asked him why the service was so poor. This erratic mail service, including days with no delivery, is not acceptable and cannot continue.

Now that you are aware of it, I know you share our concern and disappointment at our terrible service. On behalf of our residents, we would appreciate anything you can do to normalize and regularize our mail delivery so that it again meets your and our expectations. We would like to invite a U.S. Post Office representative to attend our next monthly Council meeting on Thursday, November 19, 2015, at 7:30 pm in the Village Office to provide us with an update about the delivery issues.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.
